

Irish Production Exercise with "Tá...ar" and "Is...liom"

Using your **Tá...ar** and **Is...le** lists, as well as vocabulary from Progress in Irish, translate the following sentences into Irish. Then construct two of your own sentences using this model. Hint: **Tá...ar** can usually use a preposition to clarify or expand the sentence. Ask or look up which one may be appropriate.

I like to eat.
Is maith liom ithe.

She has a cold today.
Tá slaghdán uirthi inniu.

He prefers the blue one. (hint: Use the word for *head* to mean 'one')
Is fearr leis an ceann gorm.

Are you worried about the old house?
An bhfuil inní ort faoin seanteach?

You guys don't care about money. (hint: skip *about*. use '*the* money')
Is cuma libh an t-airgead.

I'm sorry about the letter.
Tá brón orm faoin litir.

I remember your father. (hint: *your* and *father* are contracted)
Is cuimhin liom d'athair.

She's afraid of the dog. (hint: use **roimh** - *before, in front of*)
Tá eagla uirthi roimh an madra.

They like the red haired boy.
Is maith leo an buachaill rua.

He's in a hurry to go home now.
Tá deifir air dul abhaile anois.

We dislike writing English.
Is fuath linn scríobh Béarla.
