

Verb-Preposition Collector

We have talked about the challenge of remembering verb-preposition combinations, since these don't map one-to-one between languages. For instance, we look *at* things in English, *on* them in Irish. And in Irish we talk *with* people, not *to* them. As you encounter useful combinations, you can use this form to capture them. I've filled in a few common combinations to start. (I haven't listed every possible preposition, only the most common ones.)
